### *Principal's Report*

#### Callington Show

What a sensational day for this community at the annual Callington Show! Perfect weather resulted in a record crowd. Our school was involved in three ways. We had a STEM display in the Display Centre marquee, featuring a marble run challenge and 3D printing using the Maker's Empire software. At the official show welcome, some of our brave students performed a Bollywood progressive dance in front of a huge crowd. The students learnt this dance earlier in the year as part of their Footsteps Dance lessons. Finally, our barbecue stall was an incredible success! The stall sold out quickly, so more food was sourced and that sold quickly too! Our volunteers were run off their feet with orders for delicious bacon and egg sandwiches, sausages and cold drinks. Thanks to our Governing Council members who worked tirelessly behind the scenes to bring this together. ### School Colour Fun Run

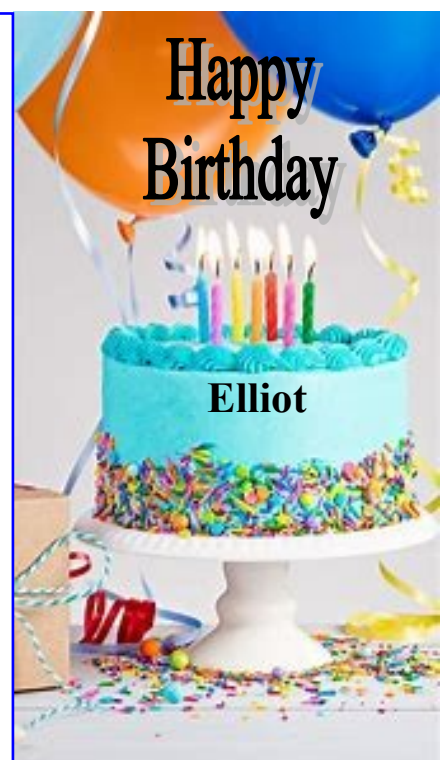
Please note we have been informed that money and the prize order forms need to be returned to the school no later than the 15th of November.

Bread Tags for Wheelchairs has been recycling bread tags in South Africa since 2006. They currently collect about 500kg/month, which funds 2-3 wheelchairs. Now we are collecting in Australia too!
