#### Hello from Jeanette!

Hello from Jeanette!

In my article today I am will refer to a post made by Jill Mills entitled "How to Raise Mentally Strong Kids". This is especially important so that children can cope with the challenges life throws at them and learn strategies for coping with these challenges. The points that Jill identified were

- 1. Get Rid of Victim Mentality (Teach them failing at something is part of life and that this can lead to learning new things.)
- 2. Don't let guilt control your choices or actions. You can still make wise and good decisions.
- 3. Don't allow fear to govern choices. Show bravery and confidence rather than acting out of fear.
- 4. Show them the world. Teach them to give rather than always taking or expecting things.
- 5. Family set up. Show them they are not in control of everything that goes on in the family. Let them know you are the parent and the one who ultimately needs to make the final choice.
- 6. Don't avoid teaching them responsibility. It may seem easier to do things yourself but they need to learn to take responsibility for their own things.
- 7. Don't expect perfection. Help them learn to bounce back when things don't go exactly as they want.
- 8. Don't shield them from pain. Help them learn to manage negative emotions.
- 9. Teach that there are consequences for actions.
- 10. Teach emotions. Help them learn to regulate their emotions.
- 11. Discipline vs. punishment. Discipline helps them learn what to do better in the future by making good choices.
- 12. Make priorities, teaching children to recognise what needs to be done first.
- 13. Don't take short cuts. Teach that patience and taking time pays off in the long run.
- 14. Teach realistic thinking and help children see what is true or not true.
- 15. Engage with Problem Solving. Talk about problems together, and discuss several possible solutions.
