Principal's report

Hello families,

I hope you had a really lovely holiday and a great start to Term 2. As usual, we have had a busy start to the term and it has been great to get into classes and see children engaging with all facets of school life.

This year, the whole school is engaging in rigorous professional learning around reading, what skills students require to be competent readers and how best to teach it. Learning to read opens up a world of opportunity for children. When children are confident readers, they stand a little taller, they can access all levels of the curriculum and their wellbeing and belief in themselves as learners significantly improves.

Our first step as a community to have a significant and effective impact on the reading progress of our children, is to prioritise reading and help students develop a love of books and reading. We need to explore, have fun and engage in books with our children to active their imagination and extend their worldly knowledge.

To ensure our children are developing into competent readers at all year levels, we require a whole school and whole community approach. This is why I am asking you as the primary caregivers, to make it a priority to read with your children everyday, make it a special "unplug" time and help your children develop that love of books and reading from the modelling that you provide. In the early years (R-2) the aim is to have fun with books, spend focused time listening to them sound words out and support them to read with increasing fluency and understanding. As they move into the higher grades, no matter how old they are, it is important to continue that shared reading with enthusiasm and to show them what a good reader looks like and sounds like. Their skill development will be focused on mastering fluency and comprehension, expression, exploring unfamiliar vocabulary and inferring of text.

Together we all need to instil that love of reading in children. Please find the time to help us on our quest to improve reading at Callington Primary School.

Why Can't I Skip My 20 Minutes of Reading Tonight?

3600 minutes in a school year


Student "B" reads 5 minutes each day

Student free day – The staff engaged in a very productive day with our curriculum lead, Lee Carter, around our literacy focus area this year "improving reading." There are 6 components of reading ("Big 6 of Reading") that are essential to develop capable and competent readers. These include oral language, phonological awareness, phonics, vocabulary, fluency and comprehension. On our student free day, we explored what we are currently implementing around reading, what that looks like in the classroom, how are we assessing our students, what our data is telling us about reading across the school and what areas we need to specifically target as areas of improvement. Over the year we will be making changes and improvements to how the components of reading are taught across the school. One of our focuses is to instil a love of reading in our children and to promote the personal benefits of exploring and engaging with books. Our next student free day will be on Tuesday 13th June where we will be continue our "reading journey."

Reading professional development in junior primary – Since the last report, Rachel Beurskens and Megan Hoad have participated in professional learning around reading called "Building foundational reading skills." This learning focussed on how best to support early years learners in their quest to "crack the code" and begin their lifelong reading journey. This training was provided by the Department in an aim to upskill all junior primary teachers to help improve phonics (sound recognition) and decoding.

School recycling – this term the year 4/5/6 students are exploring sustainability as part of their learning. They will be involving the whole school in their work and are planning to educate classes about the impact of waste and the importance of being sustainable as a society. Part of this involves the introduction of various waste recycling in our school. It will initially start small and grow organically as we put processes in place. In the first instance, we will be collecting plastic bread bags as part of the "Wonder recycling program," which was instigated by one of our members of Governing Council, Chris Evans. In this initiative, families and the community can collect their used plastic bread bags (with no crumbs in please) and deposit them in labelled cardboard boxes placed at the school. It will run from Monday 29th May to Friday 7th July. The bags will be then be returned and exchanged for free sports equipment for the school. Please support us in this initiative and send your empty bread bags with your child to school to put in our collection bins. Only bread bags please, not other soft plastics.

National Volunteers week – this week around the country we celebrate volunteers. I would like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude for the many parents and caregivers that have and continue to donate their time and effort to support our school and our students. We are very lucky to have the enthusiasm and generosity you bring to our community. Thank you very much.

OSHC developments at CPS – late last term myOSHC officially withdrew their interest in opening a service at Callington as they believed it was unviable with our numbers. This was very disappointing, however, work is continuing on exploring future options. As a small school, there are added complexities to the viability of a service and if an external provider is willing to start an OSHC, it would only be in 2024.

Staffing – I just wanted to take this opportunity to wish Matt Ratcliff all the best with his upcoming paternity leave. Matt will be looking forward to a new addition to his family and will be taking a break from school from week 5/6 onwards (depending on when baby arrives). While he is away Olga Strizhak will be teaching his Health & P.E. and Design & Tech lessons on Tuesday – Thursday. Megan and Rachel will increase their days to fulltime in their respective classrooms. We wish Matt, his wife and family the very best and look forward to seeing some happy snaps. Matt will return to us in Term 3.

The process for filling the principal position at Callington PS is drawing to its final stages and the outcome will be announced as soon as is practical.




Hello from Jeanette!


