

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Hahndorf Farm Barn Excursion







The Reception and Year 1/2 classes visited the Hahndorf Farm Barn on Wednesday 14th September. The students were immersed in an educational and "hands on" approach to learning about life on the farm. The students bottle-fed the baby lambs and goats, held chicks and fed carrots to rabbits and guinea pigs. Students watched the 'Daisy the cow show' and had a go at hand milking a cow.

Next, students fed the kangaroos, emus, ostriches, deer, miniature ponies, donkeys, and the camel. After lunch students watched a wildlife & reptile show where they got up close and personal with the lizards and python.



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
