How are you and your family going? It certainly has been the season for sickness. I hope everyone is recovering and soon feeling much better again!

Along with the Kimochi characters and their feelings, in Reception, we will be investigating some Keys to Communication (included in the Kimochi Guide).

The Keys include

1. Say someone's name, wait for eye contact (if appropriate) or attention before you speak.
2. Use a talking tone of voice instead of a frustrated tone of voice.
3. Use a talking face & relaxed body language instead of a frustrated face and tense body language.
4. Choose words that help instead of hurt. ("I feel mad because" instead of "I hate it when"")
5. Be brave and redo hurtful moments.
6. Be kind and let people try again.
7. Assume the best. ("He probably isn't mad at me, maybe he is mad because he lost the game.")

Enjoy communicating in positive ways – it leads to good outcomes.
