Callington Primary School is a small, rural, community school. We aim to build a partnership with the community focused on developing students' learning potential by encouraging improvement, achievement and success, broadening their understanding of the world so that they are able to successfully contribute as global citizens.

Our school 'BREMER' values are Bravery, Respect, Excellence, Mindfulness, Enthusiam and Responsibility.

Our children are encouraged to become 'lifelong learners', with a broad range of skills and strategies to solve problems. Our curriculum priorties currently reflect a focus on developing assessment capable learners, increasing student achievement in literacy and increasing numeracy outcomes.

Our school offer specialist instruction in Design/Technology, STEM, PE/Health and Performing Arts.

Student Wellbeing is a high priority at Callington Primary School. This is supported in a variety of ways. Our Pastoral Care Worker offers Breakfast Club and lunch time activities. She also delivers Wellbeing Classroom lessons once a week and Kimochis are often uses as a tool for emotion coaching in these lessons. Teachers use the Berry Street Education Model (Trauma Informed practices) to support classroom wellbeing, regulate emotions and develop learner resilience. All these programs promote and develop quality connections between student and between teachers and students.

- Buildings and grounds The original school building is 163 years old and has been well cared for. Extensions have been added to it to include a well equipped resource centre, kitchen and staff amenities. The school grounds are beautiful and well maintained. A range of equipment is available to students to enjoy and challenge themselves on.
- Heating and cooling All buildings are Air Conditioned and comfortable all year round
- Specialist facilities and equipment A well equipped STEM room supports our focus on robotics, 3D printing and video studies. The school has recently purchased new laptops and classroom display equipment. Our PE program is supported with a range of quality resources and equipment.
