

The Department for Education has provided us with the following update re COVID-19:-

All adults, including staff and parents, are expected to COVID Safe Check-in when entering classrooms/buildings on site. It is not necessary to check-in at the school gate to enter school grounds. The 'check-in' process is extremely important to quickly and accurately respond to new cases and hotspots. Please note that this doesn't replace your normal visitor signin process. All visitors (including parents), should continue to sign in at the office on arrival.


